



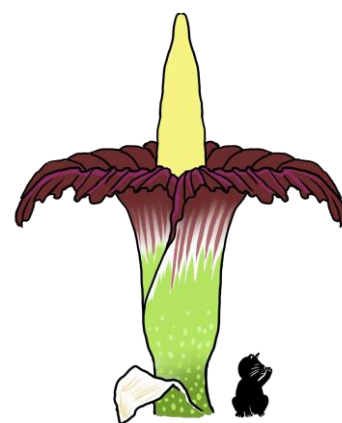
Drawing giants

Art projects:

Huge pictures are a great way to brighten your walls. This is a simple trick to scale up your drawings to something truly gigantic.



You will need:

- A picture of a flower
- Some paper
- Some pens, pencils, pastels chalks or whatever you would like to draw with
- Scissors

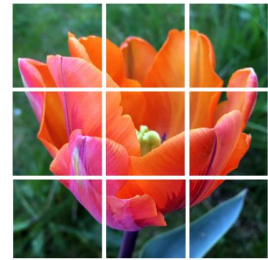
1. Getting started:

1. Watch the video on Marley's School, where Jacqui, the artist, shows us how to do this.
2. Get a picture of a flower you would like to blow up to a big picture. You could:
 - Take a picture on your walk and print it.
 - Take a picture on your walk and look at it on a phone or computer.
 - Cut a picture from a magazine or newspaper.
 - Use a picture you have already drawn.



2. Scaling up your picture

1. Lay a grid over your picture – in 4, 6, 8 or 9 equal squares.
You can draw it with a ruler. On a phone or tablet, you can often put a grid over a picture – check the settings.



2. Cut yourself squares of paper that are bigger than the squares on the picture.



3. Using pencils, coloured pens, pastels or crayons copy each square of the smaller picture onto one of the bigger pieces of paper.



4. Now put your large squares together to recreate the flower like in the video.
