



Wild Words – the Poetry of Plants

Programme Description

Inspired by the bestselling book 'The Lost Words' by Robert Macfarlane and Jackie Morris, this programme helps to hone your observation skills and train your senses as you explore the gardens. We will build up a collection of 'wonder words' to describe what we see, feel, hear, smell and touch, and create a 'word-choir' which can be used back at school to conjure up your own poems that capture the essence of your experience to share with others.



Length: Half day



Age Group: P4-7



Availability: Summer Term, Aug-Oct, Feb-Apr

Learning Outcomes

- We will explore how poets (and other creative artists) use the natural world for inspiration.
- We will use different skills and techniques to help your learners discover ways to explore expressive language.
- We will collect words together to use to create poems later.
